Task 1.1 Review, optimisation and ToK of AIM monitoring and surveillance

ML1.1 - Critical review and cost benefit analysis of different approaches implemented across Europe for AIM surveillance/monitoring, experimental design, data recording, statistical treatment of the results, spatial modelling mapping and identification of needs for harmonization and optimal exploitation (Year 2-Trimester III; GP2)

DL1.1 - Report/publication on sampling design for monitoring and surveillance of AIMs and EAIMBV in Europe, (Y3-I; GP3)

Task 1.2 Integrating surveillance data analysis, spatial modelling & mapping to ensure the quality and applicability of future technical outputs at the European level

Task 1.1

Data collection

- A Questionnaire was produced in October-December 2018
- The Questionnaire was sent in January 2019 to "superusers" (15) selected from several countries (Administrations, Universities, etc.)
- The Questionnaire will be presented at AM on Thursday, with the audience invited to fill it online; there is the possibility to suggest further persons (better placed) to fill it
- The Questionnaire will remain open up to end of February
- The Questionnaire will be also presented at EMCA meeting (F. Schaffner) 10 to 14 March; then the Questionnare will remain open for two weeks after EMCA

Data extraction and analysis

- Data extraction and analysis will be started in April with a small workshop in Brussels, to define method and design a table template, and draft the structure of the report; Then volunteers will be requested to extract data (Adolfo Ibáñez, NL; Wim Van Bortel, BE; Beniamino Caputo, IT; Mattia Manica, IT; Tatiana Sulesco, MD)
- Uploading of files (i.e. Guidelines) will be performed after Questionnaire analysis by directly contacting people; a database repository will be build and a summary template will be circulated for those documents not in English
